Program Overview

- South Asia



Leadership Structure

As a self-sustaining student leadership incubator, MUNI Global's leadership structure allows talented young leaders to be recognized for their efforts and obtain greater responsibilities. Regardless of the existence of a leadership structure, all decisions are made by consensus-building and team members at every level of responsibility are empowered in their decision-making.

Secretary-General

SGs oversee the entirety of MUNI Global, directly managing DSGs, setting program goals, maintaining administrative systems and representing the organization as a whole.

Deputy-Secretary-General

DSGs oversee a region or special program, leading teams of 5 or more diplomats to conduct outreach and ensuring that program goals are met.

Assistant Deputy-Secretary-General

Newly added for the 2021-2022 school year. Qualified student leaders who are new to MUN Impact or are exceptional diplomats become Assistant DSGs while they adjust to working in the Secretariat.

Senior Diplomat

Newly added for the 2021-2022 school year. Senior diplomats have displayed diligence and leadership potential, qualifying them to pursue special projects or mentor their peers.

Diplomat

Diplomats are divided based on their region or the special programs that they are interested in. They conduct most of the outreach as well as MUN or SDG-related projects.








MUN Impact's Reach

Development Roadmap

May 2021

- Codified the partner outreach and onboarding process
 - Explained the different options and procedures for schools, conferences, and CSOs
- Established a program-wide Drive database to house ~500 files to serve the needs of the team

July 2021

- Established a joint partnerships database between MUNI Global HS, MUNI Global Uni, and 100k Deeds
 - Holds info for 174 partners across 3 programs
 - Fosters cross-program cooperation
- Held a partner orientation event on July 3rd

August 2021

- Built out a public-facing partnerships webpage
 - Centralizes all important information for potential partners
- Built out 21-22 public-facing leadership team webpage

September 2021

- Built out a public-facing recommended conferences list
 - Offered our MUN conference partners additional visibility
- Created a organization promotional deck to be shared across all MUNI programs
 - Strengthened cross-program cooperation



September 2021

- Built out a Club Creation Package for partners needing resources/advice for their new MUN clubs
 - Comprehensive, free resource that covers:
 - Steps to setting up a MUN club
 - Country research skills
 - Position paper writing skills
 - Speechwriting skills
 - Debate skills

October 2021

- Launched a diplomat recruitment drive in OMUN, Jr.OMUN, and MUN@Home
 - The result of seeing the value of cross-program cooperation within MUNI
 - Boosted recruitment in South Asia and MENA
- Created an internal record-keeping system for MUN and SDG partnership projects
 - Allows us to measure our success tangibly (57 completed partnership projects)
- Launched Senior Diplomat scheme
 - To incentivize and reward strong diplomats
 - Round 1 of promotions in January 2022, 21 recipients
 - Round 2 of promotions in April 2022, 9 recipients
- Started a WhatsApp group chat for members of our partner community
 - 79 members
 - Effective means of sharing information with our partners



November 2021

- Reconstituted the 100k Deeds Translation Team into a Global Translation Team jointly administered by 100k Deeds and MUNI Global
 - Comprised of 20 translators operating in all 6
 UN languages (Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian, and Spanish) and more
 - Completed its first assignment in March 2022
 - Translated promotional material for the GWoA SDG 16 Art Contest into French, Hindi, Spanish, and Japanese
- Established the Club Kickstarters initiative to raise funds for under-resourced MUN clubs in Nigeria and Ecuador
 - Made possible with the help of local educators from MUNI national affiliates MUNI Nigeria and MUNI Ecuador
 - Each club only needs \$50 for a Club Kickstarter kit consisting of:
 - MUN handbooks, country placards, SDG learning materials, etc.
 - Raised enough to sponsor 30 clubs in Nigeria and Ecuador (~\$1500 USD)
 - Actively sponsoring 10 clubs in Nigeria
 - i.e. GDJSS Bindigari, Pine Crest College,
 Hamash International College, etc.

January 2022

- Announced the first cohort of DSG Excellence Award recipients
 - Reem Al Marei, Rita Araújo, Khizran Fatima,
 Ivan Wei



February 2022

- Established the Principal Secretary role as a secretariat-level posting to handle administrative duties
 - Effective for the 2022 to 2023 school year

April 2022

- Announced the second cohort of DSG Excellence Award recipients
 - Ryan Cotzen, Yone Shou Saw, Chandrasnata Mohanty, Ayomide Ajakaiye
- Organized the MUN Impact-Best Buddies Equality Expo from April 18th to 24th
 - Themed around 3 strands of lesser-known forms of inequality (Vaccine Access, Treatment of the Disabled, Victims of Climate Change)
 - 106 registrants from all 7 continents
 - Attendees from Afghanistan, Kenya,
 Vietnam, Italy, etc.
 - o 3 guest workshops and 1 peer discussion forum
 - Dr. Pallabi Roy, Digiswasthya

Club Kickstarters

As a way of developing synergies between the high school leadership at MUNI Global and MUNI national affiliates MUNI Nigeria and MUNI Nigeria, Club Kickstarters was founded in November 2021 as a functional subdivision led by DSGs Ayomide Ajakaiye and Ryan Cotzen. Local educators from our national affiliates have been building clubs and promoting MUN and SDGs in their respective countries for years now, seeing great success.



However, with the COVID-19 pandemic and the uncertainties it brought, it became critical to find a sustainable way to financially support these burgeoning student clubs in Nigeria and Ecuador. Therefore, the high school diplomats and DSGs at Club Kickstarters have taken up the mantle to harness the power of social media, word-of-mouth, and content creation to secure funding for these clubs.



\$50 USD per club sponsors a Club Kickstarters kit consisting of:

- A MUN handbook
- 40 country placards
- SDG placards
- MUN stickers



2021 to 2022 Outcomes:

- Raised enough money for 30 clubs in Ecuador and Nigeria (~\$1500 USD)
- Actively supporting 10 clubs in Nigeria from Yobe state to Osun state

2022-2023 Goals

As the team transitions and looks ahead to a new year of service, having a clear set of goals upon which we can focus our energies has become critical.
